THE CHAIN FORGE HOTEL

The Chain Forge Hotel restoration/renovation is moving forward with submittals this summer of a Risk Assessment and the Release Abatement Measure (RAM) Plan to the Environmental Protection Agency, and the submittal of a Historic Preservation Tax Credit application to the National Park Service and the



Massachusetts Historical Commission. The \$90-\$100M project is proposing minimal changes to the historic façade of the building but requires replacement of materials that have deteriorated beyond repair or been contaminated by the forge activities. It is estimated that environmental cleanup costs alone will be approximately \$12.5-\$13M. Because of these factors, State and Federal Historic Preservation Tax Credits are needed along with grants and other forms of assistance to ensure financial viability of the project.

A hotel operator has been selected and an Operating Agreement for the building is close to completion. A parking agreement is being finalized and a location has been identified at

the Autoport for a valet operated secure parking area for both Hotel Occupants and Restaurant users. A third party restaurant space in the Head-House of the building is planned, but no specific restaurant has been identified.

As the approvals are received from the reviewing agencies, the plans will be finalized and the project will start construction. The developer has pledged to work with the community during the construction period in an attempt to mitigate the impacts from the construction on the residents and to ensure that pedestrian and vehicular travel are not interrupted. As was the case during the construction of the Starboard Place condominiums, a program goal to hire locally will be implemented

The partners focused on designing a dining experience with a casual concept, knowledgeable servers, and the use of local foods and beverages whenever available. In the wood-fired oven some of John's creations include rustic pizzas, award winning roasted meatballs and crispy maple pork belly. His charcuterie board is one of the most beautiful and delicious in Boston. Selecting and serving beer and wine is an art for Michael with his carefully curated selection of beers, wine and cocktails paired with John's seasonal menu items. To present an eclectic beverage list featuring thirty beers on tap, some bottled beers and a reserve beer list the servers have to be well versed in beer and wine. To help a guest choose from the extensive list the servers ask guests about one's individual tastes and present tasters to help decide.

The most recent additions to the Brewer's Fork is an outdoor patio which opened last spring and Sunday Brunch featuring breakfast and lunch selections brunch pizzas and small plates. Stop in to experience avocado toast, squaffles (squash waffles) or a cast iron frittata to name just a few.

The Brewer's Fork is open Monday-Friday from 11:30am-11:00pm. Saturdays from 11:30am-11:30pm. Sundays from 10:30am-11:30pm, brunch is available on Sunday's from 10:30am-3pm.
